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Conferences

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Background

May HEPAP meeting

- The subject of conferences, was raised (by Bob Tschirhart), particularly the growing number of conferences.
- DOE-HEP expressed interest in receiving advice on this question, particularly as they provide support to a number of conferences and workshops (& of course, travel funds for conferences).

Situation = There are many conferences of many types.

- The professional societies (APS, EPS, IUPAP, also IEEE, others) sponsor
- There are a large number of other international conference series, with their own governance.
- Plus others, some smaller, some specialized, etc.

A partial list (with the help of Patty McBride):

C11/IUPAP sponsors Lepton Photon, ICHEP, Neutrino, (1/2yr) TIPP (1/3yr) and IPAC (1/yr) C12/C4/C19 (Nuclear, Cosmic Rays/Astroparticle, Astrophysics) IUPAP sponsor other intl conf's EPS (1/2yr) and DPF (1/2yr) both have major conferences every 2 years (same as LP) APS has the April meeting

PAC OC (IEEE-NPSS & APS-DPB) has an accelerator conference in US (1/1.5yr) There are many other instrumentation conferences (Vienna, IEEE, Vienna, Elba,)

Conferences

Role

Conferences serve a purpose. (They are held for a purpose.)

Dissemination, communication, interaction, training, exposure.

The character of the field evolves.

 Global nature; size, number, duration of experiments; means of communication; etc.

Has the role of conferences today changed with respect to the past?

 E.g.: Do young scientists get better exposure via presentations within their large collaborations than at conferences?

To answer a question about whether there are too many conferences, one needs the answers to other questions, such as:

- What role(s) do conferences play in our field today (for students, postdocs, senior scientists)? What roles do the members of the community feel that conferences play?
- What type(s) of conferences serve the purpose best?
- What frequency of attending conferences serves scientists of the field?
- What frequency & number of conferences of various types are needed?

The answer to these questions require community input.

Next steps

Recap: Addressing the subject of conferences requires community input.

APS-DPF is an appropriate body to collect community input.

Ian Shipsey (DPF Chair) and I discussed this subject, arriving at a concept along the following lines:

- 1. DPF designs and executes a survey to gather community input
 - In consultation with DPB.
- 2. DPF reports results of survey to HEPAP, along with any conclusions.
- 3. HEPAP discusses subject, based on findings of survey and conclusions of DPF, and then advises agencies accordingly.

lan has agreed to discuss this subject and concept with DPF Chairline and Executive Committee.

U.S. Representative on ECFA

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U.S. Representative on ECFA

Background

- U.S. is invited to have a representative on ECFA.
 - Present U.S. rep is Ritchie Patterson (Cornell)

ECFA = European Committee on Future Accelerators

Role: quote or paraphrase who it advises

Restricted ECFA – what is it? (Plenary) ECFA – what is it?

- U.S. representative serves on (Plenary) ECFA
- Meets twice per year

Representatives:

- Members serve 3-yr terms, starting 1 Jan., normally renewable once.
- Appointment is by vote of (Plenary) ECFA, in response to national nominations, during November meeting.

U.S. Representative on ECFA

Situation & Update

Role of U.S. representative –

- Communications between European & U.S. communities
- The US member should be able to answer questions and discuss about the US program (i.e. be well informed about the US program as a whole).
- It would be good for the US member to be in a position in the US that would benefit from knowledge of ECFA discussions.

Ritchie Patterson has been U.S. representative for 4 years.

- Since appointment by Chip Brock (DPF Chair) & Mel Shochet (HEPAP Chair)
- Ritchie believes that it is time for rotation.

I have discussed this subject with Ian Shipsey (DPF Chair). Our conclusions:

- ECFA is intended as a community-based body; therefore, the US member would better come from the DPF side rather than the HEPAP side.
- Coupled with the considerations above concerning role, leads to the choice of a member of the DPF Executive Committee as a good representative.
